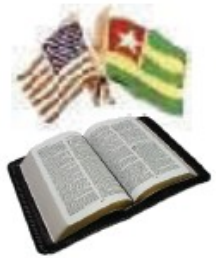

Dear Praying Partners,

We want to thank all who sent money to repair our van. The work is going well. God continues to pour out His blessings upon us as we labor for Him. We have visitors in almost every service. We went to the town of Apedokoe and started the True Light Baptist Church and God blesses the work. God is opening another door for us at Agoe-Daliko, a village where the voodoo worship is at 100%. We took the gospel to this village without fear and eight adults were saved. I started a Bible Study on Sunday afternoons, and the attendance is growing. I plan to call this little church Calvary Baptist Church.

It was a big encouragement to see American pastors come to Togo to help us. Brother Edgar Feghaly and Pastor Rick Camperson were in Togo from May 3 to May 7, for a one week seminar for more than 70 national pastors and church leaders from across Togo. Then my former Pastor McMillen came. Our desire is to see more American pastors visit Togo.

Brethren, since I come back to Togo I haven't taken a break and I've started having white hair.

-We are facing financial hardship because of the economy in America. Some of our supporting churches closed their doors, some pastors left their churches, and some churches were never able to send anything. We lost support of **fifteen** churches. We are supporting four Togolese families (three pastor students and one co-worker), although our monthly support does not cover our needs. We just live by faith.

-We are thinking seriously about coming back to the States in order to rebuild our support and raise money for the land. I still believe that a church without its own property is not a church. We rented the place for three years where we built the shelter but they can come today and said "get out." There is no respect for any law here in Togo.

-Muslim people are building mosques in every village in Togo. They are trying to change our country into an Islamic state and are putting a lot of money in our country. What we see here in Togo, if our brethren stop supporting the ministry, in 10 years the Muslim people will transform our country into an Islamic state.

**Prayer Requests:**

1. Pray for the quality of members of the True Light Baptist Church. The average of attendance is growing faster than what I expected. The average of children is now between 70-80. The month of July is the beginning of vacations and we plan to have Vacation Bible Schools.
2. Keep praying for my team. They love God and the ministry. Some still walk but they love the lost people.
3. We need the Lord's help for the airline tickets to the US (more than \$5,000).
4. Pray for the salvation of my mother.
5. Pray the work we started in 2009 with Missionary Goungampo at Korbongou in northern Togo (where most people are Muslim). This work is doing well and the Lord is opening the eyes of Muslim people. People are being saved but here too we need land.
6. The lack of transportation of my co-workers. They need a motorbike for transportation like the motorbike in this picture.
