

Hello from Togo West Africa,

We pray that everyone is doing well. The last past two months we have seen the hand of God in our ministry in spite the hard time we face. We were so busy persuading people and pleading with people to be saved. We have lead 80 people to the Lord since we came back ,and the attendance at the True Light Baptist Church is now between 40 and 45 adults every Sunday. I believe this number would be close to 60 adults if we had our own worship place. One of my cousins (Mawuli) was saved in December and he is faithful to the church. My friend, the Lord is doing a great work here in Togo, please keep praying for us. The financial situation is hard not only in the States but also in Togo. The price of everything (food, clothes, etc...) is very high. There are so many needs and we are not able to find a solution. We just keep looking to the Lord.

In the month of January we had the privilege of having Pastor Alan Jenkins, Brother Steve Anderson, Brother Marvin Basinger, and Brother Jim Lyons of the Columbia Road Baptist Church in North Olmstead, OH come down to Togo to teach three days to more than 50 national pastors. It was a wonderful training time. We want to see more American pastors to come down to see what we are doing and to give a little training to the nationals pastors. On Sunday the 18<sup>th</sup>, we had the privilege of having Brother Steve Anderson preach to my new church. We had a wonderful time preaching and it was a blessing for me and the people to see him preach the Black Book.

Brethren, this ministry needs to keep going. We prayed for God to send a music director and He sent one. He is still on the throne and I believe the Lord will provide very soon the money for the land and the shelter. I never doubt He will do it. We just need to keep praying to Him. Sometimes it is hard being patient and waiting on the Lord our savior, but we need to wait for Him. Paul says in 2 Tim 1:12, "For the which cause I also suffer these things: nevertheless I am not ashamed: for I know whom I have believed, and am persuaded that he is able to keep that which I have committed unto him against that day."

Friends, as Paul, I know whom I believe and who called me in His ministry, I prefer to suffer for Him than to quit. The time is hard, some of our supporting churches are closed but this situation will never let us down. The Lord is good and He will provide our needs. We are in a holy battle here in Togo and we are going to win by the help of our Savior.

Pray for me, on February 12-17, I will travel to the northern part of my country (600k from my place) for 4 days preaching the Black Book to the people whom the majority is Muslim.

We still need \$14,000 for land for our church, and we need \$4,925 more for the shelter.
