Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The Agbodo family greets you from Togo in the Lord's precious Name. We want to take this time to express from the bottom of our hearts our gratitude for your faithful prayers and financial support. First of all, we want to thank Fellowship Baptist Church, Goldsboro NC for helping us buy the two motorbikes we need for our ministries here in Togo. Now this need was met, two of co-workers had now their motorbike.

### Progress of the Ministry

The Lord continues to bless our ministry here in Togo. These past months, the average of attendance was 259 with a high number of children 159. This increase had led us to open a new adolescent class. The number of choir was increased to 17 members.

\*Last month we started to explore a new field in order to plant a third church in town called Aflao-Kleme. If God provides we will build a small shelter for them before July 2013.

\* On March 8 to 11, we received Rock Age Mission team (John Shelley, Peter Chamberland, Thomas Wallace, from the States and brother Nixon of Ghana) for two straight days preaching in four prisons of my country. This is my first time to visit a prison in my own country. I was impressed to see many souls in prison that need to hear the Gospel. After the preaching of Peter Chamberland on first day, I saw many that want to receive Jesus Christ as their personal savior. It was a blessing to see many inmates that confess Jesus Christ to forgive them. I want to explore more deeply this new area for our ministry here in Togo.

\* This Easter Day was a blessing day for our church; 18 precious souls were baptized and joined the church (6 men and 12 women). The number of membership kept growing. My former pastor McMillen, administrator of ABWE for West and Central Africa helped me do the baptism service.

- 1) Keep praying for our building project for our home church. We just need 60 churches to pledge \$1,000 each, to build auditorium that can hold 500 to 700 people.
- 2) I need \$300 more financial support to replace four churches that I lost in 2011-2012 due to financial trouble.
- 3) I've started to have a problem with my eyes due a lot of time spent reading. My son Samuel has the same problem. I need \$500 to buy glasses for Samuel and me, which I do not have.
- 4) We need a new good refrigerator that will cost \$800
- 5) Keep praying for my health, I teach and preach 7/7 by week. No time to relax, I just want to reach more precious souls for our Lord Jesus Christ.
