Dear Beloved in the Lord,

I hope everyone is doing well. Pastors, our ministries here in Togo are doing well in spite many challenges we are facing. God only is our strength. It is not easy to see so many doors open but there is not enough workers and support to handle all. Five villages in the north are open right now for the Gospel but we have no workers. By the grace of God people are saved month by month. These past two months were very busy for us, preaching in the village to the south and we saw many gave their life to the Lord. From May 31 to June 8, I took a team of Rock of Ages to the north preaching not only in the prisons but also to the people. Many inmates were saved and many pastors are willing now to go the prison on a regular basis preaching. Brother John Shelley (a missionary of Rock of Ages Mission) is doing an amazing prison work here in our country.

On May 25, we baptized 11 people (3 young boys, 5 women and 3 young girls) and two men joined the church. Our home church now has 93 members. The attendance keeps growing.

On June 20, we had big one day open door evangelism with brothers and sisters from two churches in Lome that came to help us. 18 people were saved that day, 1000 tracts and 1000 John and Romans were given away.

Our prayers requests:

The growing of the church lead us to plan to move close to the church but we have a big problem, there is not city water. We have to have our own drilling water (dig a well) that will cost us \$2,200 (in French we call Forage). Our desire is to be close to our people in order to have an impact in their daily lives.

Keep praying for us, we are preparing hard to open our third small church at Kleme, where 95% of that village practices a Voodoo religion. It is a spiritual fight we are going to face in that village but the victory in the name of our wonderful Savior will be on our side.

The growing of our ministry in Togo lead us to postpone our Furlough at the end of 2015 which will be 4 years on the field.

Remember us about a fund to finish the church building at Korbongou our second (\$2,400 for cement floor and plaster the walls).

Another fund of \$10,000 to finish the Sunday School building we started last October in our home church at Apedokoe. We built the first floor with our own budget. Now we are broke, and we need your help to finish the construction.

May the Lord bless all.

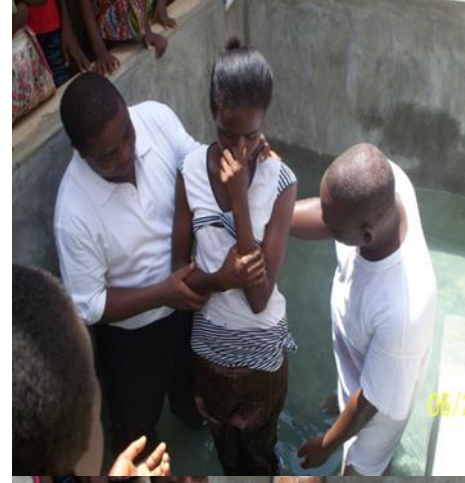
