Hello my dear Pastor and Friends ,

Hope everyone is doing well. Brothers and sisters, I came to you just to ask one request to pray for our coming to the States. We applied for R-1 Visa since February and we hope to hear from immigration service soon.

Our presence to the States is very important because we are in our 5th year on field and we have to come for furlough in order to give a report to our supporting churches and present the needs to our brothers and sisters. We have to show ourselves to our supporting churches and show them the wonderful work our Lord is doing in Togo.

All the four church plants are doing well in spite of many challenges we are facing now.

On the following pages are pictures of the ministries in South Togo.

The financial weight is so heavy on us. We are not able to face some expenses. The fast growth of our ministries with its problems is so much bigger than our pocket. At the time I am writing this letter, we have a deficit of \$570 since 2014 and this deficit was \$720 at the beginning of 2016. One faithful supporting church closed the door since December 2015. We did not hear from seven of our supporting churches since 2014 and four since January 2016. The last time I check out some have a new pastor and they dropped all the missionaries and some have lost people. This situation had a big impact in our budget. Every month we have to take from our personal fund to cover the needs of ministries.

I am not able sometimes to face my family needs. For example, I am not able to provide for my wife that needs a new stove and a new washing machine. I do understand now why many American missionaries are leaving the mission field. It is not easy when the support is not coming like you expected.

Quit is not the solution because more souls are dying everyday and our country is open for the Gospel. Many villages are open for the Gospel but there is not a preacher and the funds to plant churches are lacking. Every time 2 Tim 4:1-2 reminds myself that I need to preach in order that Togolese people may be saved.

Although with these situations we still have faithful supporting churches and friends that are doing everything to help us continue to fight for the lost souls. Our daily prayer is that the Lord will continue to bless them.
